If there's a fire






If there's a fire – get out, stay out and call 999



Make sure you can get out of the window if needed





Test it once a week



Don't remove the batteries

Carbon monoxide

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a poisonous gas that can kill you






Keep air vents clear





Fit a carbon monoxide (CO) detector Local fire stations may fit CO detectors



Heaters

Don't dry clothes on or right next to the heater





Make sure heaters work properly


Use a Corgi engineer to fix gas heaters

Indoor risks





Avoid leaving them unattended Make sure candles are secure



Keep matches and lighters out of children's reach



Smoking inside can be dangerous




Smoke outside instead






Take extra care when cooking with hot oil
